

## DANE COUNTY TARGETED COMMUNITY H1N1 VACCINATION CLINICS

**Tuesday, November 17 and Wednesday November 18  
Hall A, Exhibition Hall at the Alliant Energy Center  
1919 Alliant Energy Center Way  
Madison WI**

These clinics are targeted for residents of Dane County who are at highest risk of getting the virus and developing complications. This is one of several opportunities in the coming weeks to get vaccinated through Public Health, or through your health care provider. If you have a health care provider, please contact them first to see if they have vaccine available.

### Immunization Schedule

#### **Tuesday, November 17, 10:00 am – 6:00 pm**

- Pregnant women
- Children from 6 months – 23 months old
- Children 5 – 18 years old with underlying health conditions\*\*

#### **Wednesday, November 18, 11:00 am - 7:00pm**

- Children from 24 – 59 months old (2 through 4 years)
- People that live with children less than 6 months of age
- Child care providers of children less than 6 months of age

Families with members in multiple groups are welcome to come either day.

\*\*See back for definition of underlying health conditions.

- Gates to the Alliant Energy Center will open 30 minutes before the clinic opens. There will be no early admittance.
- 5,000 doses of vaccine will be available **each day** in both nasal mist and injectable (shot) form. The gates will close when that number is reached.
- Vaccinations are free and will be given on a first come, first serve basis.
- Children under 18 must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian.

People are encouraged to download and fill out the consent form and bring it with them to the clinic. This will help to make the process go faster.
- There will be more opportunities to get H1N1 vaccine through Public Health in the coming weeks as vaccine becomes more available. ### **What to Expect When You Arrive**

- Gates at the Alliant Energy Center will open ½ hour before the clinic opens. No one will be able to enter before that time.
- At the gate, cars will drive to the booth and get a pass for each person planning to get immunized. (If you get a pass at the gate, you can be assured there is vaccine available for you. Once vaccine supplies are depleted for the day, no more passes will be given.)
- Park and enter the Exhibition Hall.
- Once inside, there will be a line area and staff to guide clients through all stations.
- Due to limited quantities of vaccine, we cannot guarantee that you will get your preferred vaccine of choice. Individuals who are eligible for nasal spray should expect to be offered only nasal spray vaccine, reserving the flu shot vaccine for those who cannot get the nasal spray.

### **Tips for Parents**

- Keep your children with you at all times.
- We will do everything possible to keep things flowing, but we cannot estimate how long your wait will be. We recommend you bring snacks, toys, books and other things to keep your children occupied.
- If possible, do not bring children under 6 months old. They are not eligible to be vaccinated and it will unnecessarily expose them to crowds.

### **Other Information**

- If you or your child is ill with signs of an infection, please do NOT come to the clinic as we will not be able to immunize anyone with fever and other symptoms.

### **\*\*Underlying Health Conditions for H1N1 Immunization**

- Chronic lung disease, including asthma
- Cardiovascular disease, but not for high blood pressure alone
- Kidney or liver disease
- Cognitive or neurologic / neuromuscular disease – including developmental disability, cerebral palsy, spinal cord injuries, seizure disorders
- Hematologic or metabolic disorders, including diabetes mellitus
- Immunosuppression, including immunosuppression caused by medications (e.g. cancer chemotherapy) or HIV
- Sickle cell disease
- Long term aspirin therapy
